Hospitality Team

Ministry Description: Hospitality is an integral part of this role. This team will work the outpost, provide hospitality for all camp guests and work in the Art Barn. It requires a servant's heart and attention to detail as well as responsible handling of money. This will mean little things such as making welcome signs, washing and putting away dishes, and folding t-shirts to big things such as making beds to a professional standard. We hope to make our homes as ready as we'd want them to be if we were welcoming the Lord himself. We also need to be accountable to the Lord for the money which we raise in the outpost and Art Barn which makes camp possible. Our hope is that in the Fall, teens can look at a t-shirt or rosary from camp and remember their encounter with Christ at summer camp. You will be asked to keep this in mind as you work until the job is done.

Several days a week you will set-up, open and run the Art Barn or the Outpost. You will be responsible for stocking and selling materials (craft supplies, t-shirts, sodas, snacks, etc.) as well as cleaning up afterwards. The Art Barn and Outpost present great opportunities to reach out to teens so we encourage you to be relational with the teens!! This role requires good time management, attention to detail, and a friendly disposition. You may also be asked to help with other camp tasks such as preparing for family dinner, driving into Atlanta for camp related things (i.e. airport runs, equipment pick-up, etc.) and helping with one shift on another team.

The main tasks each week include:

- 1. Guest Hospitality
 - A. Go to Wal-Mart each week to buy snacks for our Leadership Team as well as cleaning supplies for designated guest houses
 - B. Make welcome signs and write welcome letters for our special guests (priests, deacons, sisters, seminarians, nurses, board members, LT staff, etc.)
 - C. Place welcome packet, snack basket and missionary t-shirts in guest houses
 - D. Prepare housing: make all beds (special guest only) as well as prepare houses and all guest lodging to be warm and welcoming for new guests each week
 - E. Maintain laundry facilities: wash linens for special guests and regular camp-wide laundry (kitchen, extra sheets for campers, occasional guest laundry)
 - F. Greet guests on Sunday/Monday and take them to their guest housing
 - G. Check in with our guests throughout the week to see if they have any additional needs or requests
- 2. Outpost
 - A. Stock and restock merchandise.
 - B. Manage and track inventory and sales.
 - C. Maintain cleanliness of Outpost facilities.
 - D. Make Italian Sodas and go to the store to buy snacks and drinks.
- 3. Art Barn
 - A. Stock and Restock merchandise.
 - B. Manage and track inventory and sales.
 - C. Set up projects before opening and maintaining cleanliness of Art Barn facilities.
 - D. Washing, rinsing, and drying tie-dye projects.
 - E. Maintaining instruments and games.

Who: Six service crew members will fill the role of Hospitality Team at Life Teen Summer Camp.

Housing: Housing for the Hospitality Team will be with fellow service crew members of the same gender.

Community: The Hospitality Team members will serve in the community of service crew. They will attend all possible formation sessions and will report to one of the office staff members for tasks and responsibilities.
