FACILITIES TEAM

- Where: Life Teen Camp Covecrest (Tiger, GA) or Life Teen Camp Hidden Lake (Dahlonega, GA), Camp Wild Sky (Burnett, TX), Life Teen Camp Golden State (Julian, CA) or Life Teen Camp Restore (Abbeville, LA & Kansas City, MO)
- Who: Work with a team of 4-6 people at GA camps or 2-3 people at Remote Camps (Golden State, Restore, Wild Sky). Facilities Team is part of Service Crew, which is the crew of people who serve behind the scenes in a variety of roles all summer long to help ensure the camp creates an environment that facilitates a relationship with Christ.
- **Community / Housing:** As a part of Service Crew, the Facilities Team will attend all possible formation sessions and will report to the Facilities Manager for tasks and responsibilities. Facilities Team members will also be housed with other Service Crew members of the same gender.
- Key Responsibilities: The Facilities Team is responsible for all aspects of
 the physical camp property, including general maintenance, repair, and
 improvement of all camp facilities, temporary structures, and activities.
 This team assists with the preparation, facilitation, and cleanup of all
 activities which occur at camp. Additionally, members of the Facilities
 Team, like all Summer Missionaries, will be responsible for assisting in
 fundraising efforts for Life Teen to further the mission of leading teens
 closer to Christ. The main tasks for the Facilities Team each week include:
 - Assisting with maintenance and repair as needed, including HVAC, plumbing, electrical, gutters and roof, and exterior maintenance;
 - o Changing or cleaning air filters in every camp building;
 - Landscaping, including grass cutting, line trimming, blowing, edging, tree trimming and removal, weeding, mulching and road / pathway maintenance;
 - Maintaining and cleaning assorted vehicles and small engine equipment;
 - Daily collecting and transporting all trash and recyclable material to appropriate dumpster / recycling center area;
 - Inventorying, procuring, and transporting fuels needed for camp operations;
 - Assisting in the setup, facilitation, and cleanup of all camp activities, including:
 - Building, lighting, maintaining, and extinguishing bonfires;
 - Setting up all non-permanent obstacle course structures;



- Preparing water activities, confession stations, and messy games;
- Replenishing disposable materials (toilet paper, cleaning supplies) in all buildings where campers stay or have sessions/activities;
- Once per week completing assigned tasks to accomplish the nightly shut down for camp;
- Checking groups out from their living space at the end of each camp week, including an inspection of the room;
- o Accomplishing all shutdown tasks at the end of each camp week;
- o Assisting with airport runs or other errands and tasks as needed.
- Success Factors: Serving as a part of the Facilities Team requires a servant's heart with an ability to receive and implement training for use of equipment needed to complete maintenance and repair tasks. This role requires the ability to take initiative, to listen and follow directions, and to be dedicated to work until the job is accomplished. A successful Facilities Team member will be able to work collaboratively with a team and also independently as needed and especially during the assigned "on night". This prayerful, mission-minded, and obedient team member will be motivated to serve humbly however needed and will serve with joy while working long hours throughout camp property.
- Physical Demands: This is a physically demanding role with extensive work outdoors, frequent non-stationary activity, and regular movement around camp property. This role requires the ability to operate a variety of tools, including small engine tools, as well as lifting up to 90 pounds.
