HOSPITALITY TEAM

- Where: Life Teen Camp Covecrest (Tiger, GA), Life Teen Camp Hidden Lake (Dahlonega, GA), Life Teen Camp Golden State (Julian, CA), Life Teen Camp Restore (Abbeville, LA & Kansas City, MO) or Life Teen Camp Wild Sky (Burnett, TX)
- Who: Work with a team of 4-6 people to fill the role of Hospitality Team at a Life Teen Summer Camp in Georgia or 2-3 people at our Remote Camps (Golden State, Wild Sky, Restore). The Hospitality Team is part of Service Crew, which is the crew of people who serve behind the scenes in a variety of roles all summer long to help ensure the camp creates an environment that facilitates a relationship with Christ.
- **Community / Housing:** As a part of Service Crew, the Hospitality Team will attend all possible formation sessions and will report to one of the office staff members for tasks and responsibilities. Hospitality Team members will also be housed with other Service Crew members of the same gender.
- Key Responsibilities: Hospitality is an integral part of Life Teen Summer Camps, and this team champions many key aspects of providing excellent hospitality at Life Teen Summer Camp primarily through preparing guest housing and creating a welcoming environment, as well as assisting in the management and maintenance of the Outpost (camp store) and Art Barn (craft / game / music area). We hope to make our homes as ready as we'd want them to be if we were welcoming the Lord himself. Our hope is that after the camp week has ended, teens can look at a t-shirt or rosary from camp and remember their encounter with Christ at summer camp. You will be asked to keep this in mind as you work until the job is done. Additionally, members of the Hospitality Team, like all Summer Missionaries, will be responsible for assisting in fundraising efforts for Life Teen to further the mission of leading teens closer to Christ. The main tasks for the Hospitality Team each week include:
 - Guest Housing / Guest Hospitality:
 - Going to Wal-Mart each week to buy snacks and cleaning supplies for designated guest houses;
 - Making welcome signs and writing welcome letters for special guests (priests, deacons, sisters, seminarians, nurses, board members, Life Teen staff, etc.);
 - Placing welcome baskets, snack baskets, and missionary t-shirts in quest houses;
 - Preparing housing to be warm and welcoming for new guests each week, including making beds and cleaning houses;



- Maintaining laundry facilities by washing linens for special guests, as well as assisting with other regular camp-wide laundry;
- Greeting guests on Sunday/Monday and taking them to their guest housing;
- Checking in with our guests throughout the week to see if they have any additional needs.
- o Outpost (camp store):
 - Setting up and opening / closing the store at specified times:
 - Stocking and restocking merchandise, including going to the store to purchase snacks and drinks;
 - Managing and tracking inventory and sales;
 - Maintaining cleanliness of Outpost facility;
 - Making Italian sodas.
- Art Barn (craft/game/music area):
 - Stocking and restocking merchandise;
 - Managing and tracking inventory and sales;
 - Setting up projects before opening and maintaining cleanliness of Art Barn;
 - Washing, rinsing, and drying tie-dye projects;
 - Maintaining instruments and games.
- Success Factors: Serving as a part of the Hospitality Team requires a servant's heart and attention to detail as well as responsible handling of money. A successful Hospitality Team member will be able to work collaboratively with a team and also independently as needed. Serving in the Outpost and Art Barn present great opportunities to reach out to teens; members of this team will be friendly and relational with the teens and adults present at camp. This prayerful, mission-minded, and obedient team member will be motivated to serve humbly however needed.
- Physical Demands: This role requires extensive daily movement around camp property and within camp homes to clean, do laundry, and make beds. This role also involves extensive work outdoors and frequent minimal lifting up to 50 pounds in order to stock and maintain the Outpost and Art Barn.
